STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section Twenty of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen of the Revised Statutes as Amended by Chapter One Hundred Seventy-nine of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen and by Chapter One Hundred Forty-seven of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen Relating to the Salary of the State Superintendent of Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty of chapter one hundred seven
teen of the revised statutes as amended by chapter one

hundred seventy-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred

and seventeen and by chapter one hundred forty-seven of the

5 public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen is hereby 6 further amended by striking out the words "four thousand" 7 in the second line thereof and by inserting in place thereof 8 the words 'seven thousand five hundred', so that said section, 9 when amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 20. The state superintendent of public schools shall 2 receive an annual salary of seven thousand five hundred 3 dollars. He shall also receive his actual cash expenses 4 incurred in the performance of his official duties which shall 5 be paid out of such funds as may be provided for that pur-6 pose. He shall appoint a deputy, and shall employ such 7 agents as may be authorized by law and such clerical assist-8 ance as he may deem necessary and as may be approved by 9 the governor and council for carrying on the work of his 10 office. The deputy state superintendent of public schools II and the agents employed by the state superintendent in 12 accordance with the provisions of this section shall receive 13 such salaries as the governor and council may approve within 14 the appropriation made by the legislature and shall also 15 receive their necessary traveling expenses incurred in the 16 performance of their official duties.'
