STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Protection of Deer in the Towns of York,
Wells, Kittery and Eliot, in the County of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person at any time
2 to hunt, chase, catch, kill, or destroy any deer in the town of
3 York, or in the town of Wells, or in the town of Kittery, or
4 in the town of Eliot, in the County of York. It shall also be
5 unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time
6 any deer, or part, or parts thereof, taken in either of said
7 towns. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay
8 a fine of not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars
9 and costs for each offense.
