STATE OF MAINE

1N THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Calling of a Constitutional Convention.

Resolved: That there is and is hereby called a constitu-2 tional convention for the purpose of amending the consti-3 tution. Said convention shall meet on the first Monday of 4 January, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, at the state 5 house at Augusta and shall consist of one hundred and 6 eighty-two members, to be nominated and elected accord-7 ing to the provisions of law, as are, and in the same num-8 ber and proportion, members of the legislature. The mem-9 bers of said convention shall receive such compensation and 10 travel as is now established by law for members of the

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II legislature and the said convention shall be the judge of 12 the election of its own members and shall choose its own 13 officers, and the expenses of said convention shall be paid 14 out of any money not otherwise appropriated. It shall be 15 the duty of said convention to correct those violations of 16 the constitution which now exist, which by any means may 17 be made therein and to form such alterations and amend-18 ments as from experience shall be found necessary and to 19 report the result of their deliberations to the governor, who 20 shall thereupon, in accordance with law, submit on the first 21 Monday of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, 22 to the qualified electors of the state of Maine the result of 23 the deliberations of said convention in the proper form of 24 question as to whether the constitution shall be amended 25 and adopted in the form proposed and determined by said 26 convention.
