STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Require the Teaching of American History and
Civil Government in Public and Private Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

American history and civil government shall be taught in
2 all common schools of elementary and high school grade,
3 both public and private, and shall be required for gradu-
4 ation from all grammar schools, both public and private.
