# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Amending Chapter Two Hundred and Forty-two of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-seven, Relating to the Retirement of Police Officers of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Chapter two hundred and forty-two of the private and
2 special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, relating
3 to the retirement of police officers of the city of Portland,
4 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "officers"
5 in the second line thereof the words 'including the captains
6 of police,' so that the chapter as amended shall read as fol7 lows:

#### HOUSE-No. 80

'The city council of the city of Portland are hereby au-2 thorized to provide by ordinance, for the retirement of po-3 lice officers, including the captains of police, who may 4 have been honorably discharged from the police force of 5 the city of Portland by reason of having arrived at the age 6 of sixty-five years, or by reason of permanent injuries or 7 permanent physical incapacity, which is the result of an 8 incident of service upon said police force, upon a pension 9 not exceeding half pay.'
