STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Authorizing Married Women and Widows to Use Family Name as Part of Name by Which They Shall Be Registered as Voters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Any married woman or widow may use her family name as 2 a part of the name by which she shall be registered as a 3 voter.
