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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

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AN ACT to Amend an Act Entitled "An Act to Incorporate  
the Knox Woolen Company."

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Section 1. Section one of chapter four hundred and thirty-  
2 two of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred  
3 and sixty-eight is hereby amended by striking out all of said  
4 section after the words "Knox Woolen Company" in the  
5 fifth line thereof and substituting in place thereof the fol-  
6 lowing:

'With an authorized capital stock of one million dollars  
2 to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, with  
3 the right by that name to sue and defend suits and to have  
4 and use a common seal, and with the privileges and powers  
5 and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the

6 laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations,  
7 and with authority to purchase and hold real and personal  
8 estate, and to improve, lease, sell, convey and otherwise  
9 manage and dispose of the same as other owners of real  
10 and personal estate may do; and with authority to manu-  
11 facture and sell yarns, paper makers' felts and textile goods  
12 of every description and composed of any and all kinds  
13 of materials in the town of Camden, in said Knox county,  
14 or elsewhere should occasion require; said corporation to  
15 have its principal office or place of general business in  
16 said Camden, and to have authority to exercise any of the  
17 powers conferred by this act, or other laws of this state,  
18 when twenty thousand dollars of the capital stock shall  
19 be taken and paid for, and with authority to make all neces-  
20 sary regulations and by-laws for transacting the business  
21 of the corporation not repugnant to the laws of this state,  
22 so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. Andrew Fuller, Albert Johnson, Horatio Al-  
2 den, David Knowlton, C. G. Bache'lder, W. G. Adams, John-  
3 son Knight, Henry Knight and T. R. Simonton, their as-  
4 sociates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a  
5 body politic and corporate by the name of Knox Woolen  
6 Company, with an authorized capital stock of one million  
7 dollars to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars  
8 each, with the right by that name to sue and defend suits  
9 and to have a common seal, and with the privileges and  
10 powers and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided  
11 by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing cor-

12 porations, and with authority to purchase and hold real  
13 and personal estate and to improve, lease, sell, convey, or  
14 otherwise manage and dispose of the same as other owners  
15 of real and personal estate may do; and with authority to  
16 manufacture and sell yarns, paper makers' felts, and textile  
17 goods of every description and composed of any and all  
18 kinds of materials in the town of Camden, in said Knox  
19 county, or elsewhere, should occasion require; said corpora-  
20 tion to have its principal office or place of general business  
21 in said Camden, and to have authority to exercise any of  
22 the powers conferred by this act or other laws of this state,  
23 when twenty thousand dollars of the capital stock shall  
24 be taken and paid for, and with authority to make all neces-  
25 sary regulations and by-laws for transacting the business  
26 of the corporation not repugnant to the laws of this state.'
