STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter Sixty-two of
the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sect. 1. Section one of chapter sixty-two of the re-
2 vised statutes of the state of Maine is hereby amended by
3 inserting in the fifth line thereof after the word "pythias"
4 and before the word "as" the words 'as a tribe of the im-
5 proved order of red men' so that said section as amended
6 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. When seven or more persons desire to be in-
2 corporated as proprietors of a social, military, literary,
3 scientific or county law library; as a masonic lodge or
4 chapter of any order or degree; as a masonic association

5 consisting of members of different orders or degrees; as
6 a lodge of the independent order of odd fellows; as a lodge
7 of the knights of pythias; as a tribe of the improved or-
8 der of red men; as a division of the sons of temperance;
9 as a tent of the rechabites; as a grange of patrons of hus-
10 bandry; as a council of the sovereigns of industry; as a
11 grand army post; as a relief or benefit association for
12 mutual assistance; as a monument or memorial associa-
13 tion; as a society to promote temperance; as a village im-
14 provement society; as an association for the promotion of
15 good municipal government; as a yacht club; or for any
16 literary, scientific, musical, charitable, educational, social,
17 military, agricultural, moral, religious, or benevolent pur-
18 pose; they may apply in writing to any justice of the
19 peace in the county, who may issue his warrant, directed
20 to one of said applicants, requiring him to call a meeting
21 thereof at such time and place as the justice may appoint.'
