# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Authorizing the Towns to Unite for the Purpose of Employing a Superintendent of Highways and Bridges.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

2 than five adjoining towns may unite in the employment of

Section 1. The selectmen of not less than three nor more

- 3 a superintendent of highways and bridges, provided they
- 4 have been so authorized by a vote of their towns at the reg-
- 5 ular town meetings, or by special town meetings called for
- 6 that purpose.
  - Sect. 2. The selectmen of the towns comprising a union
- 2 shall form a joint committee, for the purposes of this sec-
- 3 tion and the two following sections, said joint committee

4 shall be he'd as the agents of each town comprising the un-5 ion, provided however, that the selectmen of any town may 6 authorize one of its members to act for the selectmen in the 7 meetings of the joint committee, and in such case, the mem-8 ber so authorized, may cast the votes for the full member-9 ship of his se ectmen. Said joint committee shall meet an-10 nually on the first Tuesday in April at a place agreed upon 11 by the chairmen of the se'ectmen of the several towns com-12 prising the union, and shall organize by the choice of a 13 chairman and secretary. Said joint committee shall deter-14 mine the relative amount of service to be performed by the 15 superintendent in each town, fix his salary, and provide for 16 the payment of all the necessary expenses incurred while in 17 the performance of his duties, which shall be a town charge. 18 Apportion the amounts to be paid by the several towns for 19 the superintendent's salary, which shall be determined by 20 dividing the entire amount of salary paid by the several 21 towns comprising the union in the proportion of each town's 22 valuation made by the state assessors in the next prior 23 year. Said joint committee at the time of its organization 24 or as soon thereafter as possible, and whenever a vacancy 25 shall occur, shall choose by a major vote, a superintendent 26 of highways and bridges for a term not to exceed three 27 years, provided however that said committee, by a two-28 thirds vote of its full membership, after due notice and in-29 vestigation, may, discharge a superintendent of highways 30 and bridges before the expiration of the term for which he 31 was elected, and after such discharge the salary of said 32 superintendent shall cease. In the election of a superintend-33 ent of highways and bridges, the selectmen of each town 34 comprising the union shall have a vote proportional to the 35 town's share of the expenditure for the superintendent's 36 salary.

Sect. 3. The chairman and secretary of said joint commit-2 tee shall certify under oath to the state highway commis-3 sion, upon forms prescribed by said state highway commis-4 sion, in accordance with the provisions hereof, that under 5 the provisions of the two preceding sections, that a union 6 of towns has been effected, and that a superintendent of 7 highways and bridges has been employed for one or more 8 years, then, upon the approval of said certificate by the 9 state highway commission, and the presentation thereof to 10 the governor and council, a warrant shall be drawn upon the II treasurer of state for the payment to the treasurers of the 12 several towns of a sum equal to one-half of the amount ex-13 pended for the superintendent's salary by each of the sev-14 eral towns comprising the union, provided that the amount 15 so paid for a single union of towns shall not exceed seven 16 hundred and fifty dollars to all the towns comprising the 17 union in any one year.

Sect. 4. Persons emp'oyed to serve as superintendents of 2 highways and bridges shall have had practical experience 3 in the construction and maintenance of highways and 4 bridges, and devote their entire time to supervision. They 5 shall have general charge of all highways and bridges in 6 their district and see that the same are improved, repaired

7 and maintained as provided by law, and have general su8 pervision of the work of constructing, improving and re9 pairing bridges and town highways in their districts, per10 form such other duties and have such other powers as may
11 be imposed or conferred by law, or by the joint committee
12 of the several towns comprising the union, including the
13 powers and duties exercised by the town road commission14 ers.

Sect. 5. Chapter ninety-two, public laws nineteen hun-2 dred and nineteen shall not apply to towns forming a union, 3 in accordance with the provisions of the preceding sections, 4 for such a time as that union may continue in force.
