## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Reimbursing the Town of Oakland for Money Expended on Account of Mothers with Dependent Children.

Resolved: That the sum of one hundred and fifty-six dol2 lars and forty cents be, and hereby is, appropriated for the
3 purpose of reimbursing the town of Oakland for money
4 expended on account of Louise M. Shaw and her dependent
5 children and Margie E. Spaulding and her dependent chil6 dren, in the year nineteen hundred and eighteen; and that
7 the state treasurer be, and hereby is, authorized to pay and
8 deliver said sum of one hundred and fifty-six dollars and
9 forty cents to the treasurer of said town of Oakland.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

That between May fifteen, nineteen hundred and eighteen, and January twenty-four, nineteen hundred and nineteen, the said town of Oakland paid to the above named Louise M. Shaw and Margie E. Spaulding on account of their dependent children under the provisions of the statutes providing for the relief of mothers with dependent children, the sum of three hundred and twelve dollars and eighty cents; and that under said statutes governing aid to mothers with dependent children, the town of Oakland should have been reimbursed by the state for one-half of the amount thus expended, but said claim was not seasonably presented by the officers of the town of Oakland for approval by the State Board of Charities and Corrections, and that when presented for said approval the appropriation made for said purpose had lapsed, and payment of the same was refused.
