RESOLVE, in Favor of Wilson J. Holway, of The Forks
Plantation, Somerset County, Maine.

Resolved: That the sum of ten dollars be, and is hereby,

3 Plantation, Somerset county, Maine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mark H. Morris, of Caratunk, presented claim for a bob cat bounty to Wilson J. Holway, treasurer of The Forks Plantation, in due time.

Both the nose and tail of the animal were removed from the skin by Mr. Holway and, through mistake, he sent the nose to the office of the commissioner of inland fisheries and game with the claim for bounty, and destroyed the tail. Of course, the auditor's office could not allow the claim, inasmuch as the fish and game commissioner could not certify that he received from Mr. Holway the tail of the bob cat. The bounty is justly due, and this resolve is introduced for the purpose of reimbursing Mr. Holway, as he paid the claim to Mr. Morris.
