STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Requiring Political Advertisements to Be Signed. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Whoever writes, prints, posts or distributes, or causes to 2 be written, printed, posted or distributed, a circular, poster 3 or advertisement which is designed to promote the nomina-4 tion or election of a candidate for public office or to injure 5 or defeat the nomination or election of any candidate for 6 public office, or to influence the voters on any constitutional 7 amendment or any other question submitted to the voters, 8 or to influence the vote of any member of the legislature, 9 unless there appears upon such circular or poster or adver-10 tisement, in a conspicuous place, either the name of the

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11 chairman or secretary or of two officers of the organization 12 issuing the same, or of the person who is responsible there-13 for, with his name and address, shall be guilty of a misde-14 meanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not ex-15 ceeding one hundred dollars, or imprisoned for a period not 16 to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Provided, that nothing in this act shall apply to the edi-2 torial or news articles of any magazine or newspaper where 3 the same is not a political advertisement, nor to cards, post-4 ers, lithographs, or circulars, issued by a candidate adver-5 tising his own candidacy.

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
