## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT in Relation to Clerk Hire in County Offices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-five of chapter one hundred and seventeen

- 2 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out
- 3 the last sentence in paragraph one of said section, and in-
- 4 serting in place thereof the following: 'The allowances for
- 5 clerk hire in the several county offices sha'l be as follows:'
- 6 so that said paragraph one of said section forty-five shall
- 7 read as follows:

'Sect. 45. Clerk hire in county offices. 1915, c. 337. The

2 several county treasurers shall pay weekly to the clerks

3 employed by the several officials in their respective coun-

4 ties, the wages to which they may be entitled and shall take 5 individual receipts therefor. County officials for whom 6 provision for clerk hire may be made shall certify to the 7 county treasurer the names of their clerks and the weekly 8 wage at which they may be employed. Clerks shall be 9 allowed a vacation not to exceed two weeks in any one 10 year without loss of pay. The allowances for clerk hire 11 in the several county offices shall be as follows:
