IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Thirteen of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen Entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Mopang Dam and Improvement Company."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Amend section three of chapter thirteen of the private 2 and special laws of nineteen hundred and fifteen by strik-3 ing out the word "fifty" in the third line of said section and 4 inserting in lieu thereof the words 'sixty-five,' and by strik-5 ing out the word "forty" in the fifth line of said section 6 and inserting in lieu thereof the words 'fifty-five,' and by 7 striking out the words "twenty-five" in the sixth line and 8 inserting in lieu thereof the word 'forty,' so that said second tion as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 3. The said corporation may demand and receive 2 a toll for the passage of logs over or through their said 3 dams and improvements of sixty-five cents per thousand 4 feet, Holland rule scale, for all logs landed in or above 5 Second Mopang lake, and fifty-five cents per thousand above 6 the Air Line road and forty cents per thousand upon all 7 logs landed below said road. And said corporation shall 8 have a lien upon all logs and lumber which may pass over 9 any of its dams and improvements, for the payment of said 10 tolls; but the logs of each particular mark shall be holden II only for the tolls of such mark, and unless such toll is paid 12 within twenty days after such logs or lumber or a major 13 part of the same, shall arrive at the place of manufacture 14 or destination, said corporation may seize said logs and 15 lumber and sell at public auction so many and so much 16 thereof as shall be necessary to pay such tolls, costs and 17 charges thereon, after ten days' notice in writing of the time 18 and place of said sale given to the owner of such logs or 19 lumber, or his agent.'
