## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter Sixty-six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Forty-four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, Relating to Non-resident Fishing License Fees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section one of chapter sixty-six of the public laws of
2 nineteen hundred and seventeen, as amended by chapter
3 two hundred and forty-four of the public laws of nineteen
4 hundred and seventeen, is hereby amended by striking out
5 the word "fourteen" in the third line of said section and
6 by inserting in place thereof the word 'sixteen' and by strik-

7 ing out the word "two" in the eleventh line of said section 8 and by inserting in place thereof the word 'five,' so that 9 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section I. Persons not bona fide residents of the state, 2 and not actually domiciled therein, except children under 3 sixteen years of age, shall not fish for, take, catch or kill 4 any kind of fish at any time in any of the inland waters of 5 the state, or have the same or any part thereof in possession, 6 without first having procured a license therefor as herein-7 after provided. Such licenses shall be of such form and 8 style as may be prescribed by the commissioner of inland 9 fisheries and game, and shall be issued by town clerks and 10 other agents appointed by said commissioner, under such 11 regulations as may be established by said commissioner, 12 upon application in writing on blanks to be furnished by 13 said commissioner and payment of a fee of five dollars and 14 fifteen cents.'
