STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Mapleton.

Resolved: That there be paid to the town of Mapleton 2 seventy-two dollars and thirteen cents for money paid to 3 the Maine Children's Home Society for the care of Whit-4 lock's children during the months from June to December 5 of nineteen hundred and twenty.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The children referred to in the foregoing resolve were being cared for by the Maine Children's Home Society, when chapter 171 of the public laws of 1919 became effective, July 3, 1919. This law transferred the expense, in the first instance, from the town of settlement to the state, one-half to be later collected from the town. Through error the town continued to pay in full for the care of these children up to the end of December, 1919.
