STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Hartland, for Aid Rendered to a Mother with Dependent Children, During the Year Nineteen Hundred and Eighteen, Under the Provisions of Chapter Two Hundred and Twenty-two of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen.

Resolved: That there be paid to the town of Hartland 2 the sum of sixty dollars, for aid rendered to a mother with 3 dependent children, during the year nineteen hundred and 4 eighteen, under the provisions of chapter two hundred and 5 twenty-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and sev-6 enteen.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In due form, under the provisions of the Mother's Aid law, so-called, the town of Hartland rendered aid, during the year nineteen hundred and eighteen, to Mrs. Blanche L. Harding, to the amount of one hundred and twenty dollars. The town was entitled, under the law, to reimbursement for onehalf that amount, or sixty dollars, but proper vouchers were not filed by said town with the state board until after the appropriation had lapsed to the state contingent fund. This claim is now made for action by the legislature, so that the state auditor may have authority to allow, and the state treasurer to pay, the sum which is still due to said town.
