# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred and Eighteen, Section Eight, Relating to the Fees of Jurors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Chapter one hundred and eighteen, section eight, of the 2 revised statutes of the state of Maine is hereby amended 3 by striking out the word, "three", before the word "dol-4 lars", in the fourth line of said section, and inserting in 5 place thereof the word, 'four', so that said section as amend-6 ed shall read as follows:

'Grand and traverse jurors, attending the supreme judicial 2 court or superior courts, and jurors attending on any other 3 occasion prescribed by law, shall be allowed four dollars 4 a day for their attendance, and six cents a mile for their 5 travel out and home, to be paid out of the county treasury.'
