STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Amend Section Two of Chapter Five Hundred
and One of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hun-
dred and Eighty-nine, Relating to the Charter of Maine Cen-
tral Institute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter five hundred and one of the private
2 and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine is
3 hereby amended by striking out the words "Maine Free
4 Baptist Association, incorporated by an Act approved Feb-
5 ruary twenty-six, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine," and
6 substituting therefor the following words: 'United Baptist
7 Convention of Maine,' so that the section when amended
8 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. The said board of trustees shall be divided into
2 five classes of not more than five persons each, the first
3 five published in the last catalogue of said institute shall
4 constitute the first class, the second five the second class,
5 and so on through the said list, and the term of office of
6 the first class shall expire at the time of the annual meet-
7 ing of said board of trustees in the year eighteen hundred
8 and ninety, the term of office of the second class in the year
9 eighteen hundred and ninety-one, of the third class in the
10 year eighteen hundred and ninety-two of the fourth class
11 in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and of the
12 fifth class in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four,
13 and beginning at the time of the annual meeting of the said
14 board of trustees in eighteen hundred and ninety, five per-
15 sons shall be annually chosen as members of said board to
16 hold office five years each, two of the said five members to
17 be chosen by the said board of trustees and three by the
18 United Baptist Convention of Maine.'
