STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT for the Better Care of Inmates of the State Prison and Men's Reformatory Suffering from Tuberculosis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Whenever any inmate of the state prison or of the men's 2 reformatory shall become afflicted with tuberculosis so that 3 the welfare of such inmate or the safety of the other in-4 mates of such institution shall require his removal there-5 from, the board of prison commissioners or the trustees of 6 said reformatory, with the approval of the governor, may 7 cause him to be removed to one of the state sanatoriums, 8 to be there kept and treated until he may safely be returned

9 to said prison or reformatory. In the admission of new 10 patients the officers of such sanatoriums shall give preference

II to persons transferred under this act.
