STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred and Thirty-three of Private Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Eighty-one Entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Mercantile Home for Aged Men Association," as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred and Sixty-seven of Private Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Eighty-three, which Changed the Name to Home for Aged Men.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred and thirty-three of 2 the private laws of Maine for eighteen hundred and eighty-3 one entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Mercantile Home 4 for Aged Men Association," as amended by chapter two

5 hundred and sixty-seven of the private laws of eighteen 6 hundred and eighty-three changing the name of said cor-7 poration to "Home for Aged Men," is hereby amended by 8 inserting after the word "men" in the seventh line thereof 9 the words 'and also certain aged and infirm married cou-10 ples,' so that said section one as amended shall read as fol-11 lows:

'Section 1. William G. Davis, T. C. Hersey, Eben Corey, 2 Ira P. Farrington, Samuel E. Spring, H. J. Libby, William 3 W. Thomas, Edwin A. Norton, James P. Baxter, John C. 4 Proctor, and all persons who may hereafter become asso-5 ciated with them, are hereby created a corporation by the 6 name of Home for Aged Men, for the purpose of providing 7 a home for certain aged and infirm men and also certain 8 aged and infirm married couples, and by that name shall 9 have the power to sue and be sued and possess all the rights 10 and privileges under the laws of the state relating to cor-11 porations.'
