STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Dipping of Alewives and Shad in Dennys River, in Edmunds and Dennysville, in the County of Washington.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be lawful to take alewives and shad,

- 2 by means of an ordinary hand dip net, during the open sea-
- 3 son and under the restrictions and conditions provided by
- 4 the general law of the state in Dennys river, in Edmunds
- 5 and Dennysville, in the county of Washington, up as far as
- 6 the lower side of the Upper Bridge, near the Mill, so-called.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act 2 are hereby repealed.
