# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Increase the Bounty on Bears in Penobscot and Washington Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter two hundred and fourteen, section one of the pub-2 lic laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen is hereby 3 amended by striking out the word "five" in the first line of 4 said section and inserting in place thereof the word 'fifteen,' 5 and by striking out the words "in this state" in the second 6 line and inserting in place thereof the following: 'in Penob-7 scot and Washington counties and five dollars for each and 8 every bear killed in any other county,' so that said section 9 as amended shall read as follows:

### HOUSE-No. 235

'Section I. A bounty of fifteen dollars for each and every 2 bear killed in Penobscot and Washington counties and five 3 dollars for each and every bear killed in any other county 4 shall be paid to the person killing the same. If the animal 5 is killed in a town or plantation, the bounty shall be paid 6 by the treasurer thereof; if the animal is killed in an un-7 incorporated place the bounty shall be paid by the treasurer 8 of an adjoining town or plantation, if any, otherwise by 9 the treasurer of the nearest town or plantation.'
