STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Authorize the Proprietors of Portsmouth Bridge to Discontinue the Public Use of Its Bridges and to Sell Its Property and Franchises to and Merge the Same with the Boston and Maine Railroad.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. May discontinue the public use of bridges upon

- 2 the opening of new free bridge erected under provisions of
- 3 chapter forty-four, resolves of nineteen hundred and nine-
- 4 teen. Upon completion and opening to travel of a new
- 5 free bridge between Kittery, Maine, and Portsmouth, New
- 6 Hampshire, under and by virtue of the provisions of chap-
- 7 ter forty-four of the resolves of nineteen hundred and nine-
- 8 teen, the proprietors of Portsmouth bridge, a corporation

9 chartered by the laws of this state and the laws of New 10 Hampshire, or the Boston and Maine Railroad, if before 11 such opening of said new bridge it shall have acquired the 12 property and franchises of said proprietors of Portsmouth 13 bridge under and pursuant to the subsequent provisions of 14 this act, is hereby authorized and empowered to discontinue 15 the public use of the bridges of said proprietors of Ports-16 mouth bridge now maintained between said Kittery and 17 Portsmouth consisting of one bridge extending from said 18 Kittery to Ham's Island, so-called, in said Portsmouth, and 19 a second bridge known as Ham's bridge extending from 20 said Ham's Island to the mainland in said Portsmouth, and 21 thereafterwards there shall be no duty or obligation on the 22 part of said proprietors of Portsmouth bridge or of said 23 Boston and Maine Railroad in the event above provided, 24 to maintain said bridges or either of them for the use of 25 the public (other than the use of the Boston and Maine 26 Railroad, its successors and assigns) upon payment of toll 27 or otherwise.

Sect. 2. The Boston and Maine Railroad may acquire the 2 property and franchises of the proprietors of Portsmouth 3 bridge. The Boston and Maine Railroad is hereby author-4 ized and empowered to acquire, and the proprietors of Portsmouth bridge to sell to said Boston and Maine Railroad, 6 all or any part of the property and franchises of said pro-7 prietors of Portsmouth bridge upon such terms and conditions as shall be authorized by majority votes of the directors 9 and stockholders of said respective corporations taken and

10 had at respective meetings thereof duly and legally called 11 and held therefor; and upon said acquisition by said Bos12 ton and Maine Railroad of said property and franchises 13 of said proprietors of Portsmouth bridge, the same shall 14 be deemed to be merged with said Boston and Maine Rail15 road and may be enjoyed and exercised by said Boston 16 and Maine Railroad as fully and to the same extent and 17 in the same manner as otherwise they might or could be 18 enjoyed or exercised by said proprietors of Portsmouth 19 bridge; provided, however, that no such sale or merger shall 20 be valid and binding until the same and all the terms and 21 conditions thereof shall have been approved by the public 22 utilities commission.

Sect. 3. The proprietors of Portsmouth bridge or the Bos2 ton and Maine Railroad, if then the owner, may sell or
3 transfer to the said city of Portsmouth the bridge known
4 as Ham's bridge. The proprietors of Portsmouth bridge
5 or the Boston and Maine Railroad, if it shall become the
6 owner thereof under the foregoing provisions of this act,
7 is hereby authorized and empowered to sell or transfer to
8 said city of Portsmouth or to otherwise arrange with the
9 city of Portsmouth, New Hampshire, to take over, main10 tain and operate its said bridge known as Ham's bridge
11 between Ham's Island, so-called, and the mainland, in said
12 Portsmouth which is now maintained for public use, and
13 thereupon said proprietors of Portsmouth bridge or said
14 Boston and Maine Railroad, as the case may be, shall be

15 relieved, as upon discontinuance under the provisions of 16 section one of this act, of any further duty or obligation 17 to maintain or operate said Ham's bridge for the use of the 18 public upon payment of toll or otherwise.
