AN ACT to Amend Section Eleven of Chapter Forty-six of  
the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Seventy-four  
of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nineteen, Relating  
to the Furnishing of Slips by Weighers.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter forty-six of the revised statutes  
2 as amended by chapter seventy-four of the public laws of  
3 nineteen hundred nineteen is hereby amended by inserting  
4 after the word "annually" in the second line of said section  
5 the words 'elect or,' and by adding after the word "coal"  
6 in said line the words 'and coke,' also by adding after the  
7 word "delivered" in the fifth line the words 'the slips so  
8 given must have stamped, printed or written thereon the

9 full names of the weigher,' so that said section as amended  
10 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 11. The municipal officers shall annually elect or  
2 appoint weighers of coal and coke. Weighers must give  
3 slips either in writing or printing to every purchaser of  
4 coal when not in bags or packages showing the gross, tare  
5 and net weight for each and every load so delivered. The  
6 slips so given must have stamped, printed or written thereon  
7 the full name of the weigher. For each violation of this  
8 act a fine of not less than ten nor more than twenty dollars  
9 shall be imposed by courts having jurisdiction.'
