STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Southport for the Expenses of the Sickness and Burial of Lydia A. Rowe.

Resolved: That there be paid to town of Southport ninety-2 nine dollars to reimburse the town of Southport for the ex-3 penses of the last sickness and funeral of Lydia A. Rowe, 4 widow of James R. Rowe, Civil War veteran.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

She had no relatives who would be able to contribute to her support and was found by the selectmen in a destitute condition. She was taken to the hospital, where after a short sickness she died. She was buried at the expense of the town of Southport. Total expenses of the last sickness and funeral were one hundred and fifty-nine dollars, but the town has received but sixty dollars from the state.
