STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Andrew H. Morong for Services Rendered to State of Maine by Order of the Adjutant General in Investigating Cases for Local Registration Boards in Matter of Soldiers.

Resolved: That the sum of one hundred and six dollars 2 and sixty cents be and hereby is appropriated to be paid 3 to Andrew H. Morong of Portland, Maine, for services 4 rendered to State of Maine in investigating cases for the 5 local registration boards for soldiers, under the order of 6 the adjutant general of the State of Maine, arresting de-7 linguents and deserters and taking them to Camp Devens.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Andrew H. Morong of Portland, Maine, in the summer of 1918 was directed by the Adjutant General's department to investigate cases for the local boards of registration of Portland, Maine, in the matter of delinquents and deserters and to carry such delinquents and deserters to places designated, including Camp Devens, Mass. Mr. Morong performed the duties which were required of him but has not received compensation for the same. The amount due him is \$106.60.
