IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Providing for Payment for the Care of Pearl Clark, During the Year of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen.

Resolved: That there be appropriated for the payment 2 of the care of Pearl Clark, during the year nineteen hundred 3 and nineteen, pursuant of the provision of chapter sixty-4 four, revised statutes amended by chapter one hundred and 5 seventy-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nine-6 teen, the sum of twenty-seven dollars and sixty-six cents 7 (\$27.66).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The foregoing amount was expended in caring for this child under the direction of the Bangor municipal court pending hearing. The court ordered the money paid by the town of Orono, where child was living at time neglect arose. The town of Orono claims that the child had no settlement there; failed to pay the bill and claim reimbursement from the state. The appropriation of 1919 lapsed. The state is liable for this bill with right of recovery of one-half from the town of settlement, but as the appropriation has lapsed, payment cannot be made without legislative action.
