IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of C. K. Hopkins of Camden, Maine.

Resolved: That the sum of forty-four dollars and ninety 2 cents (\$44.90) be, and is hereby, appropriated to be paid 3 to C. K. Hopkins of Camden, Maine, for labor performed 4 at the Camden Fish Hatchery, during the year of nineteen 5 hundred and fourteen.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

During the term of late Commissioner Walter I. Neal, Mr. Hopkins, above named, was directed by said Commissioner Neal to erect at the Camden fish hatchery a first-class flag pole. When bill for same, in the sum of forty-four dollars and ninety cents (\$44.90) was rendered payment was deferred, as the commissioner then in office felt that the charge was too much. The matter has been considered from time to time, and now the department believes the bill should be paid, inasmuch as all of the appropriation for the year of 1914 was expended or lapsed long since, this special resolve is introduced for the purpose of paying this bill.
