STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Repeal Chapter One Hundred and Fifty-two of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Requiring a Permit from Municipal Officers for the Removal of Electric Wires and Poles When Necessary for the Repair of Streets or Removal of Buildings, and to Re-enact the Provisions of Section Thirty-one of Chapter Sixty of the Revised Statutes with Reference to the Same Subject Matter.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever desires to cut, disconnect or remove
2 the wires or poles of a telegraph, telephone, electric light
3 or street railroad company in order to move a building, alter,
4 repair or improve a street, bridge or way, or for any other

5 necessary purpose, shall leave a written statement of the 6 time when and the piace where such removal is desired, 7 at its office if it has any in that town, and if it has not, he 8 shall send it by mail to its nearest office three days before 9 such time; upon the expiration of which time, if such re10 moval is not made by the company, such person may make 11 the removal, and recover the cost thereof in an action of 12 debt. Whoever disconnects or removes such wires or poles 13 without first giving such notice, shall be fined not exceeding 14 five hundred dollars, or imprisoned not more than three 15 years.

Sect. 2. Chapter one hundred and fifty-two of the public 2 laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen is hereby repealed.
