STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Provide for Temperance Day in the Public Schools
in the State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The first Friday in March of each year or
2 the school day in each year nearest that date shall be desig-
3 nated as Temperance Day, and in every public school in
4 the State of Maine not less than forty-five minutes of the
5 school session shall be set apart and used for instruction
6 and appropriate exercises relative to the history and bene-
7 fits of prohibition and prohibitory laws, said schools to con-
8 tinue their work so far as practicable during the remainder
9 of the day.

Sect. 2. It shall be the duty of the state superintendent
2 of schools to prepare suitable material for the observance
3 of Temperance Day. It shall be the duty of all school offi-
4 cials in the several towns of the state and all public school
5 teachers within the state to comply with the provisions of
6 this act.
