**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Prohibit the Use of Motor Driven Trucks on Highways Not Having a Hard Surface, in the Spring of the Year.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall operate any motor driven vehicle which, together with the load thereon, shall exceed three thousand pounds in weight, upon any highway in this state not having a hard surface, in the spring of the year before the frost is out of the soil of said highway and the surface thereon has become settled.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days. Municipal and police courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction in prosecutions under this act.
