STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section Twenty-two of Chapter Five of the Revised Statutes, Relative to the Compensation of Boards of Registration.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section twenty-two of chapter five of the revised statutes
2 is hereby amended by striking out the words "compensation
3 not exceeding five dollars a day, to" in the sixth line of
4 said section and inserting in the place thereof the words
5 'such compensation as may', so that said section as amended
6 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 22. The president of such board shall receive five 2 dollars for each day that the board shall be in session for 3 the revision and correction of the voting lists and for com-

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4 pleting the records thereof, and the other two members of 5 said boards shall receive four dollars a day for such time. 6 They shall also receive such compensation as may be fixed 7 by the city council for such time as they are necessarily 8 employed in making up and preparing such lists of voters, 9 together with reasonable and necessary expenses including 10 blank books, stationery and the necessary assistance of 11 clerks, all of which shall be paid by the city where such 12 board is established, and each of said cities shall provide 13 a suitable place for holding the sessions of said board, and 14 pay for the services of such officers as said board may em-15 ploy and have in attendance to preserve order and execute 16 its precepts. All witness fees shall be paid at the estab-17 lished rates of fees before municipal courts.'
