STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Amend Section Eight of Chapter Three Hundred and Twenty-five of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred Ninety-seven, as Amended by Chapter One Hundred and Fifty of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen and as Further Amended by Chapter One Hundred Ninety-eight of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, Increasing the Salary of the Recorder of the Municipal Court of Waterville.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eight of chapter three hundred and twenty-five of
2 the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-
3 seven, as amended by chapter one hundred and fifty of
4 the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and fif-
5 teen, and as further amended by chapter one hundred ninety-

6 eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred
7 and seventeen, is hereby amended by striking out the word
8 "four" in the twelfth line in the first paragraph of said
9 section and inserting in place thereof the word 'five,' and
10 by striking out of said first paragraph all the words after
11 the word "office" in the thirteenth line thereof, so that said
12 first paragraph of said section as amended shall read as fol-
13 lows:

'Sect. 8. There shall be appointed by the governor, for
2 said court, a recorder, who shall keep the records of said
3 court when requested so to do by the judge; and in case
4 of absence from the court room, or sickness of the judge,
5 or when the office of judge shall be vacant, the recorder
6 shall have and exercise all the powers of the judge, and
7 perform all the duties required of said judge by this act,
8 and shall be empowered to sign and issue all processes and
9 papers, and to do all acts as fully and with the same effect
10 as the judge could do were he acting in the premises; and
11 the signature of the recorder, as such, shall be sufficient
12 evidence of his right to act instead of the judge. The re-
13 corder shall receive from the treasurer of the county of
14 Kennebec, in monthly payments, an annual salary of five
15 hundred dollars, which shall be in full for all fees pertain-
16 ing to his office.'
