STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Licenses for Lightning Rod Agents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section thirty-five of chapter forty-four of the revised stat-2 utes of Maine, nineteen hundred and sixteen, is hereby 3 amended by adding after the word "agent" in the eighth 4 line, the following words: 'For the purposes of this act 5 "such agent" shall be construed to mean the duly licensed 6 resident of this state who purchases, sells and installs such 7 lightning rod material,' so that said section as amended shall 8 read as follows:

'Sect. 35. Upon written notice from a manufacturer li-2 censed under the preceding section, of the appointment of 3 a suitable person, who must be a resident of the state, to

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4 act as his agent in this state, and upon the presentation of 5 a certificate of the good reputation and moral character of 6 such person, signed by the mayor or selectmen of the city 7 or town of which he is a resident, the insurance commis-8 sioner may, if he is satisfied that the appointee is a suit-9 able person and a resident of this state, issue to him a license 10 as such agent. For the purposes of this act 'such agent' 11 shall be construed to mean the duly licensed resident of 12 this state who purchases, sells and installs such lightning 13 rod material. Such license shall continue in force one year 14 from date of issue, but may be revoked at any time by the 15 insurance commissioner for good cause, after a hearing.'
