**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred Seventeen, Section Seventeen of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Salary of the State Auditor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Chapter one hundred and seventeen, section seventeen of
2 the Revised Statutes as amended by chapter one hundred
3 and ninety-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and
4 seventeen and as further amended by chapters two hundred
5 and fifteen and two hundred and twenty-four of the public
6 laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen is hereby amended
7 by striking out the word "three" after the word "of" in the

8 second line and by striking out the word "three" after the
9 word "said" in the second line of said section and inserting
10 in place thereof in each instance the word 'four.' It is fur-
11 ther amended by striking out the word "seventeen" in the
12 third line and inserting in place thereof the words 'twenty-
13 one,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 17. The State Auditor shall receive an annual salary
2 of four thousand dollars, and the said four thousand dollars
3 shall be appropriated each year beginning with the year
4 nineteen hundred twenty-one and paid to the state auditor.
5 He may employ in his department one permanent clerk at a
6 salary to be fixed by the Governor and Council and such ad-
7 ditional assistants as the Governor and Council may ap-
8 prove, and as may be necessary for the dispatch of public
9 business.

The Governor shall appoint a superintendent of public
2 printing, as provided in section thirty-seven of chapter three,
3 whose appointment shall be approved by the council. He
4 may employ one or more clerks and assistants as the busi-
5 ness of his office may demand, their number and the amount
6 of their compensation to be subject to the approval of the
7 Governor and Council.'
