STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of St. Albans for the
Overpaid Tax to the State of Maine.

Resolved: That there be paid to the town of St. Albans
2 the sum of twenty-nine dollars, being the amount of taxes
3 on dogs collected by the town of St. Albans which was
4 overpaid to the state of Maine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In nineteen hundred and sixteen the selectmen of the town of St. Albans returned as a number of dogs' licenses the number of dogs found when the inventory was taken.

Between the time of licensing and the time the inventory was made enough dogs had died or were killed to reduce the dog tax to the amount of twenty-nine dollars. There was, therefore, paid in to the state of Maine twenty-nine dollars more than was owed by the town of St. Albans, and the town of St. Albans asks to be reimbursed.
