**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT Additional to Chapter Thirty-three of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to Ice Fishing in China Lake, Including that Portion of Said Lake Known as Mud Pond, Which Lake Is Situated in the Town of China and in the Town of Vassalboro, in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time on or through
3 the ice in China lake, or in that portion of said lake known
4 as Mud Pond, which lake is situated in the town of China
5 and in the town of Vassalboro, in the county of Kennebec,

6 except on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of each week,
7 during which days it shall be lawful to fish through the ice
8 in said waters in accordance with the general law of the state
9 governing ice fishing.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more
3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense.
