**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT Additional to Chapter Thirty-three of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to Night Fishing in Certain Waters in Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sect. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time between eight o'clock in the afternoon and six o'clock of the following morning, in Purgatory pond or in Sand pond or in Buker pond or in Jimmie pond, said ponds being the Tacoma Chain of Lakes, so-called, situated in the town of Litchfield, and in the town of Monmouth, or in Cobbosseecontee stream

8 from Collins' Dam nor said stream to Pleasant pond, in the
9 town of West Gardiner, all of said waters being situated in
10 the county of Kennebec. It shall also be unlawful for any
11 person to have in possession at any time any kind of fish
12 taken in violation of any provision of this section.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be
2 subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty
3 dollars and costs for each offense.
