STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

RESOLVE, in Aid of Navigation on Lewy, Long and Big
Lakes.

Resolved: That the sum of one hundred and fifty dol-
2 lars (\$150) is hereby appropriated for the placing and main-
3 tenance of buoys in Lewy Lake, Long Lake and Big Lake
4 in Washington county for the year nineteen hundred and
5 twenty-one, and the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars
6 is hereby appropriated for the placing and maintenance of
7 buoys in Lewy Lake, Long Lake and Big Lake, for the
8 year nineteen hundred and twenty-two. Said buoys shall
9 be placed at such points in said lakes as will best serve the
10 needs of navigation thereon. All said money shall be ex-
11 pended under the direction of the state steamboat inspectors.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

There is much travel upon these lakes by lumbermen, tourists and sportsmen. It is the route usually taken by sportsmen and others in travelling to and from Grand Lake Stream. There are many rocks and shoals in these lakes which makes it very necessary that buoys be placed at the dangerous places to protect the tourists and others.
