STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-five of Chapter Eleven of the Revised Statutes, Requiring Monthly Settlements by Tax Collectors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section thirty-five of chapter eleven of the revised statutes

- 2 is hereby amended by striking out all of said section and
- 3 inserting in place thereof the following, to wit:

'Sect. 35. Every collector of taxes shall, on the last day

- 2 of each month, pay to the treasurer of the town all money
- 3 collected by him, and once in two months at least shall ex-
- 4 hibit to the municipal officers, or where there are none, to
- 5 the assessors of his town, a just and true account of all

6 moneys received on taxes committed to him, and produce 7 the treasurer's receipts for money by him paid; and for neg-8 lect, he forfeits to the town two and one-half per cent on 9 the sums committed to him to collect.'
