STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Regulate the Taking of Alewives in the Town of
Surry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter three hundred and five of the pri-
vate and special laws of nineteen hundred and nine, entitled
"An Act Regulating the Taking of Alewives in Patten's
Pond Stream in the Town of Surry, Hancock, County,
Maine," is hereby amended by inserting after the word
"stream" in the third line, the words 'also Flood's stream',
said section is further amended by striking out all of said
section after the word "Maine" in the fourth line, so that
said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 catch, take, kill or destroy in any manner any alewives in
3 the waters of Patten's Pond stream, also Flood's stream, in
4 the town of Surry, Hancock county, Maine.'
