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**STATE OF MAINE**

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**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

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AN ACT to Amend Section Sixteen of Chapter One Hundred and Twenty-nine of the Revised Statutes, Making Same Applicable to the Reformatory for Women, Reformatory for Men, State School for Girls, and State School for Boys.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

That Section sixteen of chapter one hundred and twenty-  
2 nine be and hereby is amended by striking out the whole  
3 thereof and inserting the following to be known as section  
4 sixteen of chapter one hundred and twenty-nine.

'Sect. 16. Trespass upon lands of Maine School for  
2 Feeble-Minded, Reformatory for Women, Reformatory for

3 Men, State School for Girls, and State School for Boys.  
4 Whoever wilfully trespasses upon lands which belong to  
5 the state and are appurtenant to the Maine School for  
6 Feeble-Minded, Reformatory for Women, Reformatory for  
7 Men, State School for Girls or State School for Boys, or  
8 whoever shall unlawfully interfere with the inmates of  
9 either of said institutions, or after notice from an officer  
10 of said institutions to leave said lands, remains thereon,  
11 shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than three  
12 months or by a fine of not more than fifty dollars.'
