STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section Eighteen of Chapter Two Hundred and Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, as Amended by Chapter One Hundred and Ninety-six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Relating to the Protection of Fish.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section eighteen of chapter two hundred and nineteen of
2 the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, as
3 amended by chapter one hundred and ninety-six of the pub4 lic laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, is hereby amend5 ed by striking out all of said section and by substituting
6 therefor the following section:

'Sect. 18. Except as hereinafter provided, there shall be

2 an annual closed season on salmon, landlocked salmon, trout,3 togue, white perch and black bass, in all the lakes and ponds4 of the state, as follows:

On salmon, landlocked salmon, trout and togue, from the 2 thirtieth day of September until the ice is out of the lake 3 or pond fished in the following spring; on white perch and 4 black bass from the thirtieth day of September until the 5 twentieth day of June following; provided, however, that 6 it shall be lawful to take black bass, with unbaited artificial 7 flies only, from the time the ice is out of the lake or pond 8 fished in the spring until the twentieth day of June follow-9 ing; provided, further, that any person who catches a white 10 perch, (or a black bass except in Great, Long, East, North, II Ellis, McGraw, or Snow pond, said ponds being part of the 12 Belgrade Chain of Lakes, so-called, in Kennebec and Som-13 erset counties, or in Lake Kezar or Upper Kezar pond, so-14 called, or in Lake Pennesseewassee, in the county of Ox-15 ford) while lawfully trolling, in good faith, for landlocked 16 salmon, trout, or togue, during closed season on white perch 17 and black bass may lawfully keep the same, but no person 18 shall in any one day keep more than six white perch and 19 two black bass so caught; provided, further, that no party 20 or the occupants of any one boat, canoe, raft or other vessel 21 or conveyance shall keep more than six white perch and 22 four black bass so caught in any one day; provided, fur-23 ther, that in Sebago lake and Long pond, in Cumberland 24 county, the annual closed season on landlocked salmon, trout

25 and black bass shall be from the first day of October to 26 the thirty-first day of March of the following year, both 27 days inclusive; and in Moosehead lake, in Piscataquis coun-28 ty, the annual closed season on landlocked salmon, trout and 29 togue, shall be from the first day of October to the thirtieth 30 day of April of the following year, both days inclusive; and 31 in Thompson pond, situated in Androscoggin, Cumberland 32 and Oxford counties, the annual closed season on landlocked 33 salmon, trout and togue shall be from September first to 34 January first of the following year; and in Lower Kezar 35 pond, in Oxford and Cumberland counties, and in Upper 36 Kezar pond, in Oxford county, the annual closed season on 37 black bass shall be from the first day of December to the 38 twentieth day of June of the following year, and on trout 39 and landlocked salmon from the first day of October to the 40 thirty-first day of March of the following year, both days 41 inclusive. In the brooks, streams and rivers of the state, 42 above tide-waters, the annual closed season on trout, salmon 43 and landlocked salmon shall be from September fifteenth to 44 the time the ice is out of the brook, stream or river fished in 45 the following spring, and on black bass and white perch from 46 September fifteenth until June twentieth of the following 47 year, except in Moose river, between Brassua lake and 48 Moosehead lake, it shall be unlawful to fish in the spring 49 until May first, and it shall be lawful to take landlocked 50 salmon and trout in the ordinary way of casting with artifi-51 cial flies, from September fifteenth to September thirtieth,

52 both days inclusive, in said portion of Moose river, and ex-53 cept in the county of Waldo, the annual closed season in the 54 brooks and streams on landlocked salmon, trout and togue, shall be from July fifteenth to the time the ice is out of the 55 56 brook or stream fished in the following spring. Provided, 57 however, that during February, March and April, in the 58 counties of Aroostook, Penobscot, Piscataguis, Somerset, 59 Washington and Hancock, and during February and March 60 in the counties of Androscoggin, Kennebec, York, Sagada-61 hoc, Knox, Lincoln, Waldo, Cumberland, Oxford and Frank-62 lin, citizens of the state may fish for and take landlocked 63 salmon, trout, togue, white perch and black bass in waters 64 open to ice fishing with not more than five set lines to each 65 family when fishing through the ice in the day time and 66 when under the immediate personal supervision of the per-67 son fishing and may convey them to their own homes for 68 consumption therein but not otherwise.

Provided, further, that it shall be unlawful to fish through 2 the ice at any time for any other species of fish except as 3 hereinafter provided:

Pickerel may be taken at any time through the ice in 2 waters open to ice fishing for landlocked salmon, trout, 3 togue, white perch and black bass, with not more than five 4 set lines to each family, or with not more than five set lines 5 to each person during the months of November and De-6 cember, when fishing through the ice in the day time and 7 when under the immediate personal supervision of the per-8 son fishing.'
