STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Amend Section One Hundred Thirty-nine of Chapter Sixteen of the Revised Statutes as Amended Relating to the Appropriation for Industrial Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section one hundred thirty-nine of chapter sixteen of the
2 revised statutes as amended by chapter seventy-seven of
3 the public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen and by chap-
4 ter eighty-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred
5 nineteen is hereby further amended by striking out the
6 words "seventy-five thousand dollars for the year nineteen
7 hundred and nineteen and eighty thousand dollars for the
8 year nineteen hundred and twenty," in the third line thereof,
9 and substituting the words 'four thousand dollars for the
10 period from January first, nineteen hundred twenty-one, to

11 June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-one, and ninety
12 thousand dollars for the year from July first, nineteen hun-
13 dred twenty-one, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-
14 two, and annually thereafter,' so that said section as amended
15 shall read as follows:

 'For the purposes of the seven preceding sections there
2 shall be deducted by the treasurer of state from the school
3 and mill fund the sum of four thousand dollars for the pe-
4 riod from January first, nineteen hundred twenty-one, to
5 June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-one, and ninety
6 thousand dollars for the year from July first, nineteen hun-
7 dred twenty-one, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-
8 two, and annually thereafter and any unexpended balance
9 of this amount shall be added to the permanent school fund.
10 All reports required under said sections shall be filed an-
11 nually with the state superintendent of public schools on
12 or before the first day of July, and state aid shall be pay-
13 able during the month of December next succeeding.'
