**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Ninety-one of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Relating to the Use of Trawls and Nets Within Certain Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter ninety-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, is hereby amended by adding after the word "more" in the second line and inserting the word 'foreign', and by striking out the "and", in the seventh line and by adding after the words "Cape Elizabeth", in the eighth line the following words, 'and from said point following the federal coast line to its

8 destination at the State boundary line', so that said section
9 as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The use of more than four thousand hooks of
2 trawl or more than ten nets by the crew of any foreign dory,
3 boat or vessel in one day within the following line is here-
4 by prohibited: Inside of a direct line drawn from Little
5 River Head to Cummings Head, Great Wass Island; from
6 Cummings Head to Schoodic Point; and from Schoodic
7 Point to east head of Isle au Haut; from east head of Isle
8 au Haut to Pemaquid Point; from Pemaquid Point to Cape
9 Elizabeth and from said point following the federal coast
10 line to its destination at the state boundary line.'
