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**STATE OF MAINE**

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**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

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AN ACT to Amend Section Thirteen of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Duties of the Secretary of the Senate.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirteen of chapter one hundred seventeen of the  
2 revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the  
3 word "two" in the eighth line thereof the following sentence:

'He shall also deliver to the librarian of the Maine State  
2 Library all papers on file in the office of the secretary of  
3 the senate which were considered by a session of the leg-  
4 islature held more than ten years previously and the state  
5 librarian shall inspect said papers and preserve all those

6 having any historical or permanent value,' so that said sec-  
7 tion as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 13. The secretary of the senate shall perform the  
2 usual duties of the office during the session of the legisla-  
3 ture, file and index all papers, which have been subject to  
4 adverse legislative action, index and supervise the publica-  
5 tion of the senate journal, and in addition thereto devote  
6 the month of December of the year following the legisla-  
7 tive session to the work of making preparation for the in-  
8 coming legislature. He shall also perform the duties re-  
9 quired of him by sections thirty and thirty-three of chapter  
10 two. He shall also deliver to the librarian of the Maine  
11 State Library all papers on file in the office of the secretary  
12 of the senate which were considered by a session of the  
13 legislature held more than ten years previously and the state  
14 librarian shall inspect said papers and preserve all those  
15 having any historical or permanent value. He shall receive  
16 a salary of fifteen hundred dollars in full for all official  
17 services by him performed during the term for which he is  
18 chosen, as follows: eleven hundred dollars at the end of  
19 the session of the legislature, three hundred dollars when  
20 the journal of the senate is completed, and one hundred dol-  
21 lars when the index of papers is completed.

The assistant secretary of the senate shall receive a salary  
2 of six hundred dollars; his work to be performed under the  
3 direction of the secretary.

The messenger of the senate shall receive a salary of four  
2 hundred dollars; the assistant messenger, folder, assistant  
3 folder, postmaster and doorkeeper shall each receive a sal-  
4 ary of three hundred dollars; the pages shall each receive  
5 a salary of one hundred fifty dollars; the official reporter  
6 shall receive a salary of one thousand dollars.

All of the above officers shall work under the direction  
2 of the president of the senate. The above salaries shall be  
3 in full for all official services by them performed during  
4 the term for which they are chosen, and no other compensa-  
5 tion shall be allowed them, except in case of an adjourned  
6 or special session of the legislature.'
