IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the Kennebec Water

District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section five of chapter two hundred of the private and

- 2 special laws, approved March seventeenth, eighteen hun-
- 3 dred and ninety-nine, is hereby amended by striking out the 4 word "two" in the twenty-sixth line and inserting the word
- 5 'five' instead thereof, so that said section as amended shall
- 6 read as follows:
- 'Sect. 5. All the affairs of said water district shall be
- 2 managed by a board of trustees composed of five members.
- 3 Two of said trustees shall be chosen by the municipal offi-
- 4 cers of Waterville, two by the municipal officers of the Fair-

5 field village corporation, and one shall be appointed by the 6 county commissioners of Kennebec county from outside said 7 district. As soon as convenient after the members of said 8 board have been chosen, said trustees shall hold a meeting 9 at the city rooms in the city of Waterville and organize by 10 the election of a president and clerk, adopt a corporate seal, II and when necessary may choose a treasurer and all other 12 needful officers and agents for the proper conduct and man-13 agement of the affairs of said district. At said first meet-14 ing they shall determine by lot the term of office of each 15 trustee so that one shall serve for one year, one for two 16 years, one for three years, one for four years and one for 17 five years; and whenever the term of office of a trustee ex-18 pires, the body which appointed said trustee shall appoint a 19 successor to serve the full term of five years; and in case 20 any other vacancy arises it shall be filled in like manner for 21 the unexpired term. They may also ordain and establish 22 such by-laws as are necessary for their own convenience 23 and the proper management of the district's affairs. The 24 term of office of trustees shall begin on the first Monday of 25 April. Said trustees may procure an office and incur such 26 expenses as may be necessary. They shall render their ser-27 vices without compensation, but shall receive an allowance 28 of five dollars apiece for each meeting of the board actual-29 ly attended.'
