RESOLVE, Reimbursing Plantations Because of Reduction in the Rate of Interest Paid by the State to Plantations on Their Wild Land School Funds.

Resolved: That there be paid the sum of three thousand, 2 three hundred and eighty-four dollars and fifty-three cents 3 to the following plantations as listed below, on account of 4 reduction in the rate of interest paid by the state to planta- 5 tions on their wild land school funds, for a period from 6 January first, nineteen hundred and nineteen, to July first, 7 nineteen hundred and nineteen; to be taken from interest 8 on lands reserved for public uses fund.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The legislature of nineteen hundred and nineteen provided for the restoring of the six per cent. rate of interest on the reserved land funds of organized plantations which rate had been reduced by the nineteen hundred and seventeen legislature from six per cent. to four per cent. At the same time a resolve was passed providing reimbursement to these plantations for the loss of two per cent during the period from July first, nineteen hundred and seventeen, when the reduction became effective, to December thirty-first, nineteen hundred and eighteen. This resolve, however, did not provide for the period from January first, nineteen hundred and nineteen to July first, nineteen hundred and nineteen, when the restored rate became effective. This resolve is to provide for the reimbursement for the six months period from January first, nineteen hundred and nineteen to July first, nineteen hundred and nineteen.
