**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Require a Fee for Registration of Milk Dealers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Each milk dealer when applying for registration as provided for by section five, chapter thirty-seven of the revised statutes, and amendments thereto, shall pay to the commissioner of agriculture a fee of one dollar for each milk depot, vehicle and place from which sales are made. All money received by the commissioner of agriculture under this section shall be paid by him to the treasurer of the state, and the same is hereby appropriated for the purposes specified in chapter thirty-seven, and sections two, three, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven and twelve of chapter one hundred thirty of revised statutes.
